IEE Thesis Presentation Competition

A unique opportunity to compete against the best undergraduates from the State's best universities.

The Fifth Annual IEE Thesis Presentation Competition will be held this year at the University of Technology, Sydney (UTS), on **Tuesday, 25th October 2005**. The evening will commence with refreshments at 5 p.m. in lecture theatre CB02.04.13 and conclude with the awarding of prizes.

What's Involved?

The competition consists of four major components:

1. Ten minutes oral presentation on a final year undergraduate thesis
2. Five minutes question and answer session at the conclusion of the presentation
3. PowerPoint presentation complementing the oral delivery.
(To be forwarded by Monday, 24th October 2005)
4. A2 sized laminated poster on the thesis for display on the walls of the lecture theatre.
(To be submitted on the night.)

What will the judges be looking for?

The competitor's final score will consist of the following components:

- 30% Oral delivery
- 30% Material and content
- 10% Quality of PowerPoint presentation
- 30% Competence in answering questions

What's at stake?

- 1st Prize - \$800
- 2nd Prize - \$300
- 3rd Prize - \$100

Who's eligible?

Any student in the final year of an undergraduate degree accredited by Engineers Australia, and who is an IEE member at the time of the competition is eligible.

How to enter

Each participating university is to select two students to partake in the competition. The selection criteria should be primarily focused on the technical merit of the student's thesis. Otherwise, the selection of entrants is left to the individual university's discretion.
